1 MS. McCLENDON: The  
2 Philadelphia Gas Commission will  
3 hold its regularly scheduled  
4 meeting on Tuesday, December 9th,  
5 at 10:00 a.m., in the Commission's  
6 hearing room on the 18th Floor,  
7 1515 Arch Street, Philadelphia,  
8 Pennsylvania, with virtual option  
9 for those who cannot attend in  
10 person, for the purpose of  
11 considering the Philadelphia Gas  
12 Works line item transfers for the  
13 FY 2025 Capital Program Year, and  
14 such other business as may properly  
15 be brought before this Commission.

22 THE CHAIR: The first item on  
23 the Agenda is the PGW Fiscal Year  
24 Capital Line -- Capital Program

1 Line Item Transfers.

2 The procedural history of the  
3 Fiscal Year 2025 Line Item  
4 Transfers Review is detailed in the  
5 Recommended Decision, which  
6 Executive Director Gemela McClendon  
7 and Commission Staff issued on  
8 November 19th. This will be marked  
9 as Gas Commission Exhibit Number-2.

11 (Whereupon, Exhibit Gas  
12 Commission-2, Recommended Decision,  
13 was marked for identification.)

14 - - -

15 THE CHAIR: I would like to  
16 ask Ms. McClendon to provide a  
17 brief overview of the Fiscal Year  
18 2025 Capital Program Line Item  
19 Transfers.

20 MS. McCLENDON: Thank you.

21 Commission Staff recommends  
22 that the Commissioners approve two  
23 interdepartmental line item  
24 transfers on behalf of PGW totaling

1           \$618,843 to address budget  
2           shortfalls in PGW's Fleet  
3           Operations Department, and to also  
4           acknowledge that PGW provided the  
5           required timely notice that it  
6           implemented to enter a departmental  
7           transfer transactions within its  
8           discretion totaling \$4,297,548.  
9           These transfers are routine and  
10          uncontested by the Public Advocate.

11                   Commission Staff would like to  
12           thank both PGW and the Public  
13           Advocate for their work in  
14           positioning this matter for the  
15           Commission to vote on today.

16                   THE CHAIR: Thank you.

17                   We would like to provide --  
18           provide the participants with the  
19           opportunity to make a brief  
20           presentation before we call the  
21           question to vote.

22                   First, we will hear from PGW.

23                   MR. DASENT: Brooke Darlington  
24           will speak to this issue from my

1 office, Madam Chair.

2 THE CHAIR: Thank you.

3 MS. DARLINGTON: Can you hear  
4 me? Can you hear me now?

5 COMMISSIONER McGRAW: Yes.

6 THE CHAIR: Yes.

7 MS. DARLINGTON: Good morning.

8 My name is Brooke Darlington,  
9 and I'm of counsel to the Law  
10 Offices of Andre Dasent, and we  
11 represent the Philadelphia Gas  
12 Works.

13 PGW agrees with the Hearing  
14 Examiner's recommendation to  
15 approve the 2025 Capital Budget  
16 Transfers.

17 Regarding the  
18 interdepartmental budget transfers,  
19 the Commission will recall that two  
20 interdepartmental budget transfers  
21 are requested in this proceeding  
22 related to planned expenditures for  
23 Fleet Operations that are needed to  
24 address budget shortfalls as a

1 result of higher-than-anticipated  
2 costs, which are clearly defined in  
3 the record.

4 As we noted in the recommended  
5 decision, the proposed budget  
6 transfers are consistent with the  
7 Capital Program protocols and  
8 supported by the evidence  
9 presented.

10 It bears emphasis that neither  
11 the Public Advocate, nor PGW filed  
12 exceptions or comments to the  
13 recommended decision.

14 The interim departmental  
15 budget transfers were -- PGW  
16 provided notification to the PGC of  
17 interdepartmental budget transfers  
18 made by the company as a right  
19 consistent with the Capital Program  
20 protocols. The transfer were made  
21 by October 31st, 2025, as required  
22 by the protocols.

23 For these reasons, PGW  
24 requests that the Commission

1 approve the capital budget  
2 transfers as recommended by the  
3 Hearing Examiner's decision.

4 Thank you.

5 THE CHAIR: Thank you, Brooke.

6 Mr. Ballenger, are there any  
7 statements of behalf of the  
8 Advocate?

9 MR. BALLENGER: Good morning.  
10 Thank you. Thank you, Madam Chair,  
11 just very briefly.

12 You know, we -- we appreciate  
13 staff's diligence in short of  
14 shepherding us through this  
15 process. Hopefully, we're finally  
16 almost done with the 2025 Capital  
17 Budget.

18 I -- I do want to note just  
19 one for -- for anyone's  
20 edification, a Summary attached to  
21 the Motion document includes the  
22 previous transfers that were  
23 approved at the October 16th Gas  
24 Commission meeting.

1           That's why the numbers don't  
2           fully -- aren't -- aren't fully  
3           described in this Motion document  
4           because some of them have been  
5           previously approved already. I  
6           just flagged that for the record.

7           But we -- we, likewise, have  
8           no concerns about these transfers.  
9           We did not violate any exceptions  
10          or comments to the Recommended  
11          Decision.

12          And, so, we endorse Staff's  
13          Recommended Decision, and believe  
14          you should approve it.

15          Thank you.

16          THE CHAIR: Thank you.

18          comments from the members of the  
19          public.
