1 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Good morning.

2 ALL PRESENT: Good morning.

3 CHAIRMAN GREEN: I would like to  
4 acknowledge the presence of a quorum for  
5 today's regularly scheduled meeting of the  
6 Philadelphia Gas Commission for today,  
7 Tuesday, August 13th, in the Commission's  
8 hearing room on the 18th Floor, 1515 Arch  
9 Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the  
10 purpose of considering the Gas Works'  
11 proposed fiscal year 2020 operating budget  
12 and related matters and such other business  
13 as may be properly brought before this  
14 Commission: to my right, Kellan White,  
15 designated for City Controller Rebecca  
16 Rhynhart; to his right, Vice Chair of the  
17 Commission, Gene Brown.

18 I would like to have the agenda read,  
19 marked, and entered into the record as Gas  
20 Commission Exhibit #1 by our Executive  
21 Director, Gemela McClendon, Esquire.

22 EXEC. DIR. McCLENDON: "The  
23 Philadelphia Gas Commission will hold a  
24 regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday,

1 August 13th, 2019, at 10:00 a.m. in the  
2 Commission's hearing room on the 18th Floor,  
3 1515 Arch Street, Philadelphia,  
4 Pennsylvania, for the purpose of  
5 considering:

6 "The Philadelphia Gas Works' proposed  
7 fiscal year 2020 operating budget and  
8 related matters; and such other business as  
9 may properly be brought before this  
10 Commission."

11 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Thank you,  
12 Ms. McClendon.

18 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Before we take up  
19 the agenda for today's meeting, I would like  
20 to state that notice of the Commission's  
21 regular meetings scheduled for fiscal 2020  
22 was published in various local newspapers  
23 and in the Legal Intelligencer newspaper on  
24 July 31st, 2019; August 1st, 2019; and

1 August 2nd, 2019. Copies of these notices  
2 will be marked and entered into the record  
3 as Gas Commission Exhibit #2.

9 CHAIRMAN GREEN: The first item on  
10 the agenda is PGW's proposed FY 2020  
11 operating budget and related matters.  
12 Section 4.2.a of the Management  
13 Agreement/Ordinance provides that PGW's  
14 proposed operating budget and forecast must  
15 be approved by the Gas Commission.

16 Section 4.2.c states that PGW's  
17 expenditures and commitments to spend must  
18 be pursuant to approved operating budgets  
19 and are subject to any Commission rules and  
20 regulations.

21 Section 6.9 gives this Commission  
22 responsibility for overseeing the operation  
23 of PGW by PFMC, and further provides that  
24 all power not specifically granted to PFMC

1 resides in the Commission.

2 The procedural history of the FY 2020  
3 operating budget review is detailed in the  
4 Recommended Decision. I will provide the  
5 highlights.

6 On February 15th PGW filed a proposed  
7 operating budget, including a PFMC Board  
8 resolution dated January 23rd authorizing  
9 submission of the budget for Commission  
10 approval, various supporting schedules and  
11 departmental budgets, as well as a letter  
12 from City Finance Director Rob Dubow stating  
13 that the FY 2020 operating budget is  
14 satisfactory as to form and extent.

15 PGW's proposed operating forecast for  
16 fiscal years 2021 through 2025 was filed on  
17 March 28th. On June 11th PGW filed its  
18 FY 2020 operating budget disadvantaged  
19 business enterprise participation forecast.

20 Review began with written data  
21 requests addressed to PGW and continued with  
22 informal discovery meetings among the  
23 parties on May 9th and May 15th.

24 The Public Advocate filed the direct

1 testimony of its witness on June 11th, and  
2 on June 13th a public hearing was held  
3 before Hearing Examiners Gemela McClendon,  
4 Erin Lai, and Heidi Wushinske.

5 On June 27th PGW and the Advocate  
6 each submitted briefs, which will be marked  
7 respectively as Gas Works Exhibit #1 and  
8 Public Advocate Exhibit #1.

14 CHAIRMAN GREEN: On July 11th  
15 Executive Director Gemela McClendon and  
16 Commission Staff issued a Recommended  
17 Decision, which will be marked as Gas  
18 Commission Exhibit #3.

24 CHAIRMAN GREEN: On July 18th the



1 Public Advocate filed one exception and one  
2 comment to the Recommended Decision. PGW  
3 did not file any comments or exceptions.  
4 The Advocate's submission will be marked as  
5 Public Advocate Exhibit #2.

6 - - -

7 (Whereupon the court reporter marked  
8 for identification purposes Public Advocate  
9 Exhibit #2.)

10 - - -

11 CHAIRMAN GREEN: To facilitate our  
12 preparation for today's meeting, Commission  
13 Staff developed a Briefing Guide. This  
14 document outlines the Hearing Examiners'  
15 recommended budget adjustments and other  
16 recommendations, summarizes the Advocate's  
17 exception and comment, and provides Staff's  
18 comments and suggested disposition of the  
19 exception.

20 A partial draft of this document was  
21 shared with the parties on August 2nd to be  
22 sure it accurately summarized the Advocate's  
23 filed exception and comment. The Advocate  
24 confirmed that its filing had been

1 accurately described. PGW also confirmed  
2 that the Briefing Guide looked fine.

3 The finalized version of the Briefing  
4 Guide, which was shared with the parties on  
5 August 13th, will be marked as Gas  
6 Commission Exhibit #4.

12 CHAIRMAN GREEN: I would like to ask  
13 Ms. McClendon to provide an overview of the  
14 recommended budget and the issue areas still  
15 in dispute.

16 EXEC. DIR. McCLENDON: This year the  
17 PGW operating budget proceeding actually  
18 presented very few disagreements regarding  
19 the numbers. Ultimately, the issue area  
20 that's still in dispute is a policy one.

21 Instead of really going over in  
22 detail those issues, I would like to thank  
23 the parties actually for their hard work in  
24 getting this fiscal '20 operating budget to

1           this point.

2                       When PGW approached Commission Staff  
3           and the Public Advocate last year or earlier  
4           this year actually saying that it would like  
5           to have the operating budget taken care of  
6           before September, the actual start of the  
7           fiscal year, contrary to what has been done  
8           in all the prior years before this, I can  
9           personally say -- and I'm sure Commission  
10          Staff would agree with me -- that there was  
11          a bit of concern whether or not we would be  
12          able to get it to this point.

13                      We were all able to do so because of  
14          the hard work put in not only by Commission  
15          Staff but by PGW and the Public Advocate, so  
16          I would like to thank you both for your work  
17          on this to position this for a decision by  
18          the Commission.

19                      I would also like to reiterate  
20          something that I think I have probably said  
21          on a few occasions. The reason why we are  
22          able to make these sorts of things happen is  
23          because of effective communication between  
24          the parties, and I sincerely hope that going

1 forward we can continue to move in that  
2 direction, where we all are communicating  
3 effectively, so that at the end of the day  
4 we are bringing forth a budget that is  
5 appropriate and beneficial not only to PGW  
6 but also to the ratepayers in the City of  
7 Philadelphia, who ultimately own the Gas  
8 Works.

9 Thank you.

10 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Thank you.

11 Although the parties have clearly set  
12 forth their positions in their written  
13 submissions, we would like to provide them  
14 with the opportunity to make a brief  
15 presentation of their concerns and responses  
16 to the filed exceptions.

17 First we would like to hear from PGW.  
18 Mr. Dasent?

19 MR. DASENT: We did not file any  
20 exceptions in this case and we were in full  
21 agreement with the Recommended Decision, so  
22 we have nothing left to summarize except we  
23 are with Gemela, Erin, and Heidi on this  
24 one.

1 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Okay.

2 Mr. Ballenger, are there any  
3 statements on behalf of the Advocate?

4 MR. BALLENGER: Good morning,  
5 Mr. Chairman, members of the Gas Commission.

6 We did set forth one exception and  
7 one comment in writing, which I'm sure  
8 you've reviewed.

9 The exception is based on the  
10 conditional spending for builders risk and  
11 environmental coverage. Those are specific  
12 coverages that PGW would not need to obtain  
13 until after the closing of its LNG expansion  
14 project transactions. So we believe that  
15 the actual release of spending authority  
16 should be tied to the event which causes PGW  
17 to have to incur expenditures.

18 The Recommended Decision, basically  
19 because it's tied to what the Commission did  
20 in the last budget, before we really  
21 undertook review of the term sheet for the  
22 LNG, the conditions that were approved at  
23 that time required approvals by City  
24 Council. So in fiscal '19 PGW actually got

1 immediate spending authority and conditions  
2 released for those coverages, which it  
3 hasn't needed to spend.

4 We wanted to reflect the reality that  
5 there are some steps that have to be taken  
6 before PGW would need to spend and we  
7 proposed a very modest additional condition,  
8 which was notification of the closing of the  
9 transactions. So that was the exception  
10 that we put forth on conditional spending  
11 authority.

12 We did pose one additional comment  
13 that goes really to the integrity of the  
14 review process and I took a brief scan at  
15 the Commission's prepared Motion, so I see  
16 that our views did not resonate with you and  
17 I am dismayed by that.

18 When I enter a hearing and I have  
19 presented an issue that I believe needs to  
20 be discussed at a hearing, I anticipate that  
21 the witnesses who would rebut my witness  
22 would be available and present.

23 And, yes, we had no problem with the  
24 agenda itself. It's a piece of paper. What

1 we had a problem with was the conduct of the  
2 hearing and the fact that PGW's position  
3 changed and was announced without witness  
4 support on the record at the hearing.

5 That's particularly true with regard  
6 to the software for matter management, where  
7 we suggested conditional funding, we  
8 believed we were moving towards some kind of  
9 agreement, and then a different proposal was  
10 put forth by PGW's counsel on the record  
11 without any witness support.

12 That's just not how we're used to  
13 operating here. So we put a comment out  
14 there and I hope that in the future  
15 communication can resolve that.

16 But, as I said, I think it's up to  
17 PGW, if we're not going to come to an  
18 agreement, to present its witnesses; and  
19 until the hearing was actually conducted, we  
20 had no idea PGW was going to sort of modify  
21 that position that day and at that time.

22 So it's not a major issue. We are  
23 where we are. It's a small dollar amount.  
24 But we do prepare for hearings with the

1 expectation that we are going to see the  
2 witnesses and be able to talk to the  
3 witnesses, and we present our witness for  
4 that for purpose as well.

5 So I just wanted to go over those  
6 things and it's all pretty much set forth  
7 there in writing so you have had a chance to  
8 review it, and I would offer to answer any  
9 questions you may have.

10 Thank you.

11 MR. DASENT: Mr. Chairman, if I might  
12 just say in response, on environmental and  
13 builders risk insurance, we did litigate  
14 that issue and it was subject to certain  
15 conditions that we would spend the money,  
16 and the release of the money was conditioned  
17 upon City Council approval, the approvals  
18 for the project, and those approvals were  
19 met simultaneously actually on the hearing  
20 date because that was the same date that we  
21 were before City Council.

22 At the same time, since we have those  
23 approvals at this point in time, we should  
24 not be moving the goalpost, and I think



1 that's the thrust of what I read the  
2 Recommended Decision as saying, don't change  
3 the conditions now.

4 We had the conditions, those  
5 conditions have been met; therefore, the  
6 risk management or the environmental/  
7 builders risk insurance should be approved  
8 for release in terms of conditional funding  
9 authority.

10 In terms of the witnesses, we always  
11 try to work with the Staff and the Advocate  
12 concerning witnesses to be presented. As I  
13 mentioned a minute ago, we had a hearing  
14 where some senior Staff were in City Council  
15 at the same time we were doing the operating  
16 budget hearing, so everybody was not in the  
17 room.

18 But we did stipulate to a host of  
19 issues in terms of those issues that might  
20 have otherwise had an exchange between  
21 either lawyers or lawyers and witnesses and  
22 we tried to accommodate the situation that  
23 was presented, and we certainly have no  
24 intent of denying availability of witnesses

1 to the Public Advocate.

2 Also, our senior Staff, Joe Golden,  
3 was in the room and could speak to all of  
4 the issues in his position, as well as Bill  
5 Gallagher and Steve Schummer, who were also  
6 present throughout the hearings.

7 There was no particular expert on the  
8 work management program for Legal; but,  
9 frankly, we're trying to find, in the  
10 universe of available programs that are  
11 available for the purpose of managing  
12 hundreds of cases in our Legal Department,  
13 the proper fit and I don't know that anyone  
14 can discuss that with great knowledge.  
15 We're sort of lawyers finding our way.

16 The best fit we will describe to you  
17 when we find it, share all the procurement  
18 issues with you, and Raquel Guzman indicated  
19 that we should be flexible and work with the  
20 Staff in coming up with a condition that  
21 would satisfy them and we did.

22 So we're satisfied on our side of it  
23 and we wanted to make sure the Commission  
24 notes that we are always trying to work with

1 Staff and the Advocate to have the witnesses  
2 in the room that are necessary.

3 We had an efficient hearing. It did  
4 go through a process that ended in a lot of  
5 stipulations and it seemed as if we were  
6 engaged and talking with one another.

7 So I'm hopeful that we'll have a good  
8 and successful experience in the next  
9 hearing and I will reach out and redouble my  
10 efforts to make sure witnesses are in the  
11 room that the Advocate wants.

12 Thank you.

13 EXEC. DIR. McCLENDON: Chairman  
14 Green, can I just add one thing?

15 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Yes.

16 EXEC. DIR. McCLENDON: Just to  
17 clarify the record, the witness list was  
18 shared with all sides prior to the hearing  
19 and everyone agreed that it looked good.

20 You know, Staff can't address issues  
21 of witness availability if we don't find out  
22 about it until the day of the hearing and  
23 that's why we make sure that a witness list  
24 is shared, so that if someone is not on that

1 list that needs to be present in the opinion  
2 of either side, that can be vocalized and we  
3 can make arrangements for them to be there.

4 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Any additional  
5 comments from either party?

6 MR. BALLENGER: Nothing further.

7 CHAIRMAN GREEN: All right.

8 Are there any comments or questions  
9 from any of the Commissioners at this point?

10 COMMISSIONER BROWN: No.

11 ALTERNATE COMMISSIONER WHITE: No.

12 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Thank you all very  
13 much. We appreciate your participation as  
14 we deliberate on PGW's budget.

15 All of the identified exhibits will  
16 be entered into the record of this meeting.  
17 This matter is now before us for action.

18 I call on Vice Chair and Commissioner  
19 Gene Brown for a recommendation and motion.

20 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.

21 My Motion is set out in a written  
22 document with one appendix, and I ask that  
23 it be marked and entered into the record as  
24 Gas Commission Exhibit #5.

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(Whereupon the court reporter marked for identification purposes Gas Commission Exhibit #5.)

COMMISSIONER BROWN: A draft was circulated to Commissioners in advance of this meeting. This Motion was distributed to the parties just prior to the start of this meeting.

The Recommended Decision suggested various line item adjustments and reporting requirements. I would like to thank Commission Staff and the parties for their work to narrow the areas of disagreement in this budget proceeding.

To summarize, the Advocate submitted one exception and one comment. PGW did not submit any exceptions or comments. I will briefly address the Advocate's exception and comment.

The Advocate filed an exception to the Hearing Examiners' recommendation to reject the Advocate's request to place

1 further restrictions on funds for  
2 environmental and builders risk insurance  
3 coverage.

4 The Advocate proposed that PGW be  
5 unable to spend the budgeted funds for  
6 environmental and builders risk insurance  
7 coverage at the Passyunk Plant until after  
8 it notifies the Commission of the closing of  
9 the transactions to effectuate the P3  
10 liquified natural gas project at that  
11 location.

12 The Hearing Examiners instead  
13 recommended that no such notification be  
14 required because the conditions for the  
15 release of this funding were established in  
16 the Commission's LNG order and resolution  
17 and did not require subsequent notification.

18 As the Hearing Examiners noted, this  
19 Commission established standards for the  
20 release of conditional funding in the fiscal  
21 year 2019 operating budget proceeding.

22 Further, it is my opinion that the  
23 Hearing Examiners accurately found that this  
24 Commission's order and resolution related to

1 the LNG project found that PGW had offered  
2 sufficient evidence to satisfy the release  
3 of conditional funding, consistent with  
4 those standards set forth in the fiscal year  
5 2019 operating budget order.

6 Specifically, this Commission  
7 approved the release of conditional funding  
8 after all necessary City approvals and  
9 authorizations had been effectuated,  
10 including the passage of the related  
11 ordinance into law.

12 The LNG bill was passed by Council on  
13 June 13th, 2019, and signed by the Mayor on  
14 July 3rd, 2019. Therefore, the requirements  
15 were satisfied as of that date and the  
16 inclusion of these funds into fiscal year  
17 2020 is merely a carryover, and PGW has  
18 already agreed to use these funds only for  
19 their designated purpose.

20 I am satisfied with the conditions  
21 this Commission imposed in the LNG order. I  
22 therefore believe that we should reject the  
23 Advocate's exception.

24 The Advocate also filed a comment

1 regarding PGW's witness availability, in  
2 which it stated that PGW failed to present  
3 witnesses at the hearing to discuss several  
4 subjects identified in advance.

5 In the Recommended Decision the  
6 Hearing Examiners agreed with the Advocate  
7 that it is necessary that PGW provide  
8 appropriate personnel for ID sessions and  
9 public hearings to ensure that a thorough  
10 and accurate record is captured.

11 However, the Hearing Examiners  
12 further noted that this requires effective  
13 communication between the parties and Staff.

14 I agree with the Advocate and the  
15 Hearing Examiners that having the  
16 appropriate witnesses available is  
17 important.

18 Going forward, I urge the Advocate,  
19 or any party that finds itself in a similar  
20 situation, to clearly communicate any issues  
21 that it has regarding witness availability  
22 to the parties and Staff.

23 As the Recommended Decision sets out,  
24 there were multiple communications between



1 the Advocate, PGW, and Staff regarding the  
2 witnesses needed for the hearing.  
3 Specifically, the proposed hearing agenda  
4 with a witness list was shared before the  
5 hearing. The Advocate replied that it was  
6 fine with the agenda. Then, on the day of  
7 the hearing, the Advocate stated that it had  
8 issues with witness availability.

9 Given these circumstances, I do not  
10 believe that Staff or PGW could have  
11 reasonably anticipated that the Advocate  
12 would take issues with witness availability,  
13 when the Advocate was given the chance to  
14 note any concerns it may have had prior to  
15 the hearing.

16 Therefore, I move that the Gas  
17 Commission adopt the Recommended Decision  
18 and take the following actions:

19 1. Reject the Philadelphia Gas  
20 Works' fiscal year 2020 operating budget  
21 proposal as filed on February 15th, 2019.

22 2. Approve a fiscal year 2020  
23 operating budget for PGW which projects  
24 total operating revenues of

1           \$671.849 million, including total gas  
2           revenue of \$684.205 million and which  
3           projects natural gas expense of  
4           \$195.123 million, as shown in PGW's proposed  
5           budget.

6                     3. Resolve that conditional spending  
7           authority for a legal work management system  
8           will not be released unless PGW has  
9           submitted: a. Notification to the  
10          Commission regarding the procurement/RFP  
11          process; b. Specifics of the software; and  
12          c. An implementation timeline.

13                    4. Direct PGW to file a compliance  
14          operating budget for fiscal year 2020  
15          consistent with this Motion within ten  
16          business days of today's meeting, provided  
17          that PGW should be instructed to identify  
18          and make any technical corrections to the  
19          presentation in the appendix hereto,  
20          ancillary adjustments, or flow-through  
21          changes.

22                    5. Direct PGW to file, by no later  
23          than the 15th day of the succeeding month  
24          for each month in fiscal year 2020, monthly

1 financial reports in the same format as used  
2 for the fiscal year 2019 reporting.

3 6. Direct PGW to file, by no later  
4 than the 15th day of the succeeding month  
5 for each month in fiscal year 2020, monthly  
6 collections status reports with a scope and  
7 in a form similar to the monthly reports  
8 filed for fiscal year 2019.

9 These reports will also include  
10 copies of any and all deliverables provided  
11 by any PGW consultants related to PGW's  
12 collections procedures and policies,  
13 including CRP program modifications.

14 7. Direct PGW to continue to file  
15 its monthly "Detailed Metrics" reports  
16 regarding attaining of annual enterprise  
17 metrics and quarterly "Operating Statistics"  
18 reports with a scope and in the form agreed  
19 to with Commission Staff pursuant to the  
20 direction provided by Ordering Paragraph 7  
21 of the Commission's fiscal year 2015  
22 operating budget decision.

23 8. Direct PGW to file its proposed  
24 fiscal year 2021 operating budget with

1 supporting documentation by no later than  
2 May 22nd, 2020.

3 9. Reject all other recommendations,  
4 exceptions, and comments pertaining to the  
5 Recommended Decision regarding all fiscal  
6 year 2020 operating budget issues which seek  
7 adjustment or other action not mentioned in  
8 this Motion.

9 This concludes my Motion.

10 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Thank you,  
11 Commissioner Brown.

12 Is there a second to the motion?

13 ALTERNATE COMMISSIONER WHITE: Second.

14 CHAIRMAN GREEN: It has been properly  
15 moved and seconded.

16 Is there any discussion on the  
17 motion?

18 - - -

19 (No response.)

20 - - -

21 CHAIRMAN GREEN: At this point I  
22 would like to call for the question on the  
23 motion. All in favor?

24 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Aye.

1 ALTERNATE COMMISSIONER WHITE: Aye.

2 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Aye.

3 Any opposed?

9 (Whereupon the motion was unanimously  
10 carried.)

12 CHAIRMAN GREEN: The next item on the  
13 agenda is such other business as may  
14 properly be brought before this Commission.

15 Is there any other business to be  
16 brought before this Commission?

19 - - -

20 CHAIRMAN GREEN: Any commentary from
